


## ISN Program Numbers by Region in 2017









# Membership: NIS & Russia


## CURRENT MEMBERS BY COUNTRY



Total Members in the Region: **113**


# Membership Growth Rate 2015-2017: NIS & Russia

## **Pioneer Award Winner for NIS & Russia Region:**

Dr. Kanatbayeva graduated Medical School in Almaty, Kazakhstan in 1964. She defended her PhD thesis and Postdoc dissertation on Ig-A nephropathy in Moscow Research Institute of Pediatrics, and continued her clinical, educational and academic activity in Kazakhstan. She is a recognized founder and leader of nephrology in her motherland. Since early 1970-s she worked hard to develop the care for patients with kidney diseases - not only children, but also adults.





# Global Kidney Health Atlas: RESULTS



This survey demonstrated **significant inter- and intra-regional variability** in the current capacity for kidney care across the world.

# Identified Gaps

## Key kidney care gaps:

**Frequent kidney health workforce shortages** (esp. Africa, Middle East, OSEA)

**Poor availability of healthcare services for identifying and treating kidney disease**

- **Under utilisation of peritoneal dialysis (80%) and kidney transplantation (79%)**
- **Low rate of public funding for kidney care (35% comprehensive coverage)**
- **Few countries had national strategy for kidney disease (CKD 44%, AKI 16%)**
- **Lack of kidney disease registries** (esp. non-dialysis CKD and AKI)
- **Poor access to guidelines (~50%)**
- **Sparse advocacy structures for kidney disease (CKD 42%, AKI 19%)**
- **Deficient research capacity (31% no capacity)**

# Global Kidney Policy Forum

## Key Facts

- Organised by the ISN & SLANH in coordination with The Lancet & endorsement of Secretaría de Salud in Mexico.
- Held on Friday April 21<sup>st</sup>, 8:00 – 14:00
- Aim: to review the burden of kidney disease in the Americas region and share strategies for prevention and improved management at regional/global level.
- Brought together Health Ministry officials, WHO/PAHO reps, key opinion leadres and health community reps.
- First of a series of Global Kidney Policy Forum meetings to take place every 2 years.



# Regional Boards

## **Chair and Deputy Chair**

acting as regional representatives to the Council,

- coordinating regional priorities and Regional Board input
- acting as main points of contact to provide regional perspective for ISN

- **Regional Board members at large**

- acting as country representatives to the regional Board,
- coordinating country priorities and input
- acting as main points of contact to provide country perspective for ISN

# Regional Responsibilities:

Evaluate and prioritize - understand, review and determine **priorities** for ISN activities in the region

- Engage regional community - create links with regional societies and Governments and their members to share information
- Facilitate activities - work with relevant ISN staff, Council, Committee and ExCom members to create the necessary regional adaptations for successful implementation of ISN activities

# ies: Regional Board

Each member of a Regional Board is accountable via the Regional Board Chair to the relevant regional membership for representing each region's perspective within the ISN activities

- Each member of a Regional Board is accountable via the Regional Board Chair to the membership for ensuring good oversight of the Council for adherence to the ByLaws, Policies and procedures of the ISN

# ns: Regional Boards

Regional Board Chair and Deputy chairs will be **elected**:

Regional Boards will nominate individuals for the position of Deputy-Chair from among members in their region.

- The Nominating Committee will review the names proposed by the Regional Boards, and create a short list for each Deputy-Chair position
- An election will be held by vote of ISN members from that region.
- Those elected as Deputy-Chairs will serve a two year term, and will then succeed the Chair, serving as Chair for two years.
- Deputy Chair **cannot be from the same Country** as the Regional Board Chair.
- The Regional Board should include as far as possible **one member from each country** within the region.
- General inclusivity provisions - per the ISN **Diversity** policy, all nominations and candidate choices should embrace and proactively implement a mix of diverse candidates related to gender, ethnic, cultural and regional perspectives.

# of Boards

Each Regional Board should be as **inclusive** as possible

The members should include the following but can be modified as regional circumstances dictate:

- All Councillors in the Region
  - All members of ISN Programs and Committees from the region
  - One Exec Committee Liaison (Vivek Jha)
  - At least one member of the Young Nephrologists Committee
  - Selected members chosen for energy and commitment
  - President(s) or representative(s) of relevant affiliated nephrology societies as communicated to ISN
- Each Regional Board can elect a Core Group of 7-15 members to develop strategy and monitor activities.
